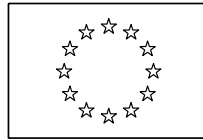

Employment Visa

BlueCard, qualified occupations Persons, who have a recognized degree of higher education and a corresponding job offer from Germany, can apply for an employment visa (Blue Card, qualified job) at the German Embassy in Myanmar.

Extensive information in this regard is available in German and English language via www.make-it-in-germany.com. Detailed information regarding the recognition of foreign degrees of higher education are offered by ANABIN, the information portal for the recognition of foreign educational attainment (<http://anabin.kmk.org>).

Visas can also be issued for graduates to seek employment for a maximum period of six months. If a work placement can be found within this time, the local Aliens Authority (Ausländerbehörde) can issue the residence permit directly.

Non-academic skilled workers with a recognised vocational training can also receive a residence permit to work in Germany in many technical and other areas. The recognized professions are listed in the "Positivliste" of the Federal Employment Agency (Bundesagentur für Arbeit; www.zav.de/positivliste).

The applicant must find out, in an established procedure, if his/her foreign formal vocational qualification conforms to a profession in the Positivliste

The homepage of the Federal Employment Office guides through this procedure of assessment of equivalency.

The said office is included in the visa processing and examines the application with regard to the prerequisites as specified by the employment regulations, among other things the compliance with the provision of the minimum wage legislation. The minimum wage is currently 1.621,- € for 40 hours weekly working time.

It is strongly advised that a preapproval of the Federal Employment Agency is presented upon submission of the visa application. Your employer in Germany can help you with this.

The visa application fee is the equivalent of EUR 75.00. This non-refundable charge is payable in USD in cash at the prevailing Embassy exchange rate when applying.

Original documents must be submitted with 1 copy. All documents in Myanmar language have to be accompanied by a notarized translation into English.

Check list of documents needed for the application

1.	<p>Two application forms for a national visa duly completed in German or English and signed.</p> <p>2 recent photographs no more than 6-months old, 35–40mm in width, white background, close up of your head and top of your shoulders so that your face takes up 70–80% of the photograph, in sharp focus and clear. No Photoshop!</p>	
2.	<p>Original passport</p> <p>Provide two photocopies of the passport data page.</p>	
3.	<p>Work contract from Employer in Germany which should contain the following details:</p> <p>Type, content and duration of the intended occupation, the weekly working hours, the place of work, the amount of remuneration, the place of issue, the contract date and the signatures of both contracting parties</p>	
4.	<p>Evidence of qualification: e.g. diplomas, certificates, proof of recognition of the degree.</p> <p>You can inquire on the databank ANABIN http://anabin.kmk.org if your foreign degree of higher education is equivalent and the institute of higher education is recognized. If your degree / institute of higher education is not registered in the data base you will have to have an evaluation of your qualification carried out by the Central Office for Foreign Education Systems (Zentralstelle für ausländisches Bildungswesen (ZAB)).</p> <p>https://www.kmk.org/service/erkennung-auslaendischer-abschluesse/zeugnisbewertung-fuer-auslaendische-hochschulqualifikationen.html</p>	
5.	<p>Language knowledge German language knowledge may not be the requirement for the issuance of the residence permit to take up employment or seek employment. But good language knowledge is indispensable for a residence in Germany. It is therefore advisable to acquire language knowledge of at least level B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference.</p>
