# 1. Development-Related Postgraduate Courses (EPOS)

#### Target group:

 Master courses for young professionals from developing countries

# Funding:

• Master:861€/month

• Travel allowance, health, accident and personal liability insurance, a study and research subsidy as well as rent subsidies and/or allowances for spouses and/orchildren

# Main requirements:

- Candidates fulfil the necessary academic requirements and can be expected to successfully complete a study programme in Germany.
- Candidates have a Bachelor degree (usually a four-year course) in an appropriate subject and have at least two years' professional experience.
- Candidates can prove their motivation is developmentrelated and be expected to take on social responsibility and initiate and support processes of change in their personal and professional environment after their training/scholarship.

Application deadline: depending on the selected course and apply directly at the university

# 2. Helmut-Schmidt-Programme (PPGG)

# Target group:

• Open for well qualified graduates with a first university degree (bachelor or equivalent) who want to actively contribute to the social and economic development of their home countries (Africa, Latin America, South Asia and Southeast Asia, from countries in the Middle East as well as from the Ukraina). The scholarships are offered both for young graduates without professional experience and for mid-career professionals.

#### Funding:

- Master:861€/month
- 6 months for German language course
- Travel allowance, health, accident and personal liability insurance, a study and research subsidy as well as rent subsidies and/or allowances for spouses and/or children

#### Main requirements:

- Candidates fulfil the necessary academic requirements and can be expected to successfully complete a study programme in Germany.
- Candidates have a Bachelor degree in an appropriate subject which should have been obtained during the six years prior to the application for the scholarship.

Application deadline: from June 1st to July 31st depending on selected study course

# 3. Study Scholarships - Postgraduate Studies in the Field of Architecture

#### Target group:

 Applicants who have gained a first university degree in the areas of Architecture, Interior Design, Monument Conservation, Urban Planning/Urban Development, Regional Planning, Landscape Architecture and Landscape Planning at the latest by the time they commence their scholarship-supported study programme

#### Funding:

- Master: 861 €/month
- A Master's degree/postgraduate degree leading to a final qualification, or a complementary course that does not lead to a final qualification (not an undergraduate course) at a state or state-recognised German university of your choice

#### Duration:



- Master:861€/month
- A Master's degree/postgraduate degree leading to a final qualification, or a complementary course that does not lead to a final qualification (not an undergraduate course) at a state or state-recognised German university of your choice

#### **Duration:**

• Between 10 and 24 months depending on the length of the chosen study programme or project

#### Main requirements:

- As a rule, applicants should have taken their final examinations no longer than six years before the application deadline.
- Applicants who have been resident in Germany for longer than 15 months at the application deadline cannot be considered.

#### **Duration:**

• Between 10 and 24 months depending on the length of the chosen study programme or project

#### Main requirements:

- As a rule, applicants should have taken their final examinations no longer than six years before the application deadline.
- Applicants who have been resident in Germany for longer than 15 months at the application deadline cannot be considered.

## 1. Development-Related Postgraduate Courses (EPOS)

#### Target group:

- PhD students in below-mentioned subjects:
- Development Studies ZEF: University Bonn
- Agricultural Economics, Bioeconomy and Rural Development: Justus-Liebig University Giessen and University Hohenheim
- Resource Nexus for Sustainability Transformations (NEXtra): TU Dresden, UNU-FLORES and IOER

# Funding:

- PhD:1.200€/month
- German language course, travel allowance, health, accident and personal liability insurance, a study and research subsidy as well as rent subsidies and/or allowances for spouses and/or children

### Main requirements:

- Candidates fulfil the necessary academic requirements and can be expected to successfully complete a study programme in Germany.
- Candidates have a Bachelor (usually a four-year course) and master degree in an appropriate subject and have at least two years' professional experience.

## 2. Research Grants

- a. Doctoral Programmes in Germany (3 or up to 4 years)
- b. Bi-nationally Supervised Doctoral Degrees (1 up to 2 years)
- c. One-Year Grants (7 to 12 months)

#### Target group:

 Academics and scientists who have completed a Master's degree

#### **Duration:**

• depends on programme and the research proposal. can be from 7 to maximum 48 months.

### Funding:

- Master: 861€; PhD: 1.200 €/month
- German language course, travel allowance, health, accident and personal liability insurance, a study and research subsidy as well as rent subsidies and/or allowances for spouses and/or children

### Main requirements:

- Applicants should have graduated with a master's degree no longer than six years before the time of application.
- Applicants should have a letter confirming supervision by a university professor in Germany in case of doing PhD in individual doctoral programme/ an admission letter from German university in case of doing PhD in a structured doctoral programme.



For applicants from the fields of human medicine, veterinary medicine and dentistry, other regulations are applicable.

# 3. DLR-DAAD Research Fellowship Programme

# Target group:

 Highly-qualified foreign doctoral and postdoctoral students and senior scientists, who have research topic in the fields of Aeronautics, Space, Transportation and Energy

### **Duration:**

• Type A - Doctoral Students: 36 months

## Funding:

• Type A - Doctoral Students: 1.760 €/month

# Main requirements:

At the time of their application, applicants for a DLR-DAAD Fellowshipmust

- be able to prove their outstanding study or research achievements,
- Type A: have completed their studies or research with a university degree not more than six years ago,
- have an excellent knowledge of English; knowledge of German is advantageous,
- not be of German nationality.

# 4. Graduate School Scholarship Programme (GSSP)

## Target group:

• Excellently qualified doctoral candidates and young academics and scientists who have completed a Master's degree or Diplom, or in exceptional cases a Bachelor's degree at the latest by the time they begin their scholarship – depending on the graduate school

#### Funding:

• Monthly payments of 1.200 €

• Travel allowance, health, accident and personal liability insurance, a study and research subsidy as well as rent subsidies and/or allowances for spouses and/or children

# Apply procedure:

 Only after applying at a participating graduate school (see www.daad.de/gssp for the list of participating graduate schools you can apply to and for further information) and being nominated for a scholarship by said graduate school, you are asked to upload your application in the DAAD portal.

# III. Scholarships for university lectures and researchers:

#### 1. Re-invitation Programme for Former DAAD Scholarship Holders

**Target group:** DAAD Alumni who must have returned to their home country at least three years previously and have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or research institute in their home country

#### **Duration:**

One to three months; the length of the grant is decided by a selection committee and depends on the project and the applicant's work schedule.

### Funding:

- 2.000 €/month for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers
- 2.150 €/month for professors
- Travel allowance

# Main requirements:

- Applicants should hold a doctorate degree.
- Applicants must work at a university or institute of higher education in their home country.
- The research project must be coordinated with an academic host institute in Germany.

Application deadline: Beginning of April and October. Please check the exact date at the link below.





# 2. Research Stays

**Target group:** Lecturers at a university and researchers from research institutes who have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or research institute in their home country

#### **Duration:**

One to three months; the length of the grant is decided by a selection committee and depends on the project in question and the applicant's work schedule.

#### Funding:

- 2.000 €/month for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers
- 2.150 €/month for professors
- Travel allowance

#### Main requirements:

- Applicants should hold a doctorate degree.
- Applicants must work at a university or institute of higher education in their home country.
- The research project must be coordinated with an academic host institute in Germany.

**Application deadline:** April and October. Please check the exact date at the link below.





# 3. DLR-DAAD Research Fellowship Programme

**Target group:** Highly-qualified foreign doctoral and postdoctoral students and senior scientists, who have a research topic in the fields of Aeronautics, Space, Transportation and Energy

#### **Duration:**

- Type B Postdoctoral Students: 6 to 24 months
- Type C Senior Scientists: 1 to 3 months

#### Funding:

- Type B Postdoctoral Students: 2.400 €/month
- Type C Senior Scientists: 2.760 €/month

#### Main requirements:


At the time of their application, applicants for a DLR-DAAD Fellowship must

- be able to prove their outstanding study or research achievements,
- Type B: have completed their studies with a PhD not more than two years ago,
- Type C: be working in higher education or at a research institute; positions are open to outstandingly qualified academics and scientists who should generally hold a doctorate/PhD,
- have an excellent knowledge of English; knowledge of German is advantageous,
- not be of German nationality.

# IV. Other programmes:

# 1. DIES Training Courses

The programme "Dialogue on Innovative Higher Education Strategies" (DIES) offers modular, practice-oriented training opportunities for management level professionals from universities in developing countries. The training offers are based on a blended-learning approach.

**Target group:** Management level professionals from universities in developing countries

#### Funding:

- Travel costs, course expenses, accommodation and joint meals
- For some courses, participants' home institutions are expected to pay a one-time co-funding fee of between 300€to 600€.

#### **Participants' Profile:**

- Management level professionals from universities in developing countries
- Applicants hold at least a Master's degree
- Excellent English language skills
- Each course has its own further, specific requirements

# 2. Study Visits by Groups of Foreign Students

**Target group:** University teachers from a public and staterecognised foreign university are eligible to apply for a group of maximum 15 students.

Duration: 7 to 12 days



#### 3. Practical Traineeships for Foreign Students of Natural and Technical Sciences, Agriculture and Forestry (IAESTE – Association for the Exchange of Students for Technical Experience)

**Target group:** Students of Natural and Technical Sciences, Agriculture and Forestry who are enrolled in member countries of the IAESTE

Duration: Usually 2 to 3 months, in some cases longer

**Funding:** 861€/month and medical, accident and personal liability insurance

# Main requirements:

Applicants must be enrolled at a university throughout the internship period. The internships in Germany are offered abroad exclusively through the respective IAESTE national committees, which in turn find internships for German university interns.
